Washington, Aug. 2.-The following is the official statement given out by the President as to the terms of peace offered by the United

In order to remove any misapprehension in regard to the negotiations as to peace between the United States and Spain, it is deemed proper to say that the terms offered by the United States to Spain in the note handed to the French Ambassador Saturday last are in substance as

indemnity, but requires the relinquishment of all claim of sovereignty over or title to the island of Cuba, as well as the immediate evacuation by Spain of the island.

The cession to the United States and immediate evacuation of Porto Rico and other islands under Spanish sovereignty in the West Indies

The United States will occupy and hold the city, bay and harbor of Manila, pending the conclusion of a treaty of peace which shall determine the control, disposition and government of the Philippines.

If these are accepted by Spain in their entirety, it is stated that commissioners will be named by the United States to meet commissioners on the part of Spain, for the purpose of concluding a treaty of peace on the basis above indicated.
