

James T. Burke, inspector of boilers, believes that those inspection is the only possible under government supervision.

Boiler inspection is only possible under government supervision; while we have some powers under section 20 (g) of the Ontario Factories Act, yet we occasionally receive reports of boiler explosions which did not apply under the act.

The hydrostatic tests consist in applying a cold water pressure to the boiler, and in some cases, after which the inspector looks the boiler carefully over in all parts to see if there are any signs of leakage or distress of any kind.

Watch the Steam Gauge. Internal boiler inspection is made by looking the boiler over from outside to make sure that the attendants are carrying out a higher degree of care than is required by the law.

What Factories Act Says. James R. Brown, inspector of factories, said in his report regarding boiler inspection: "The inspection of boilers in factories, where the boilers are not licensed, is a matter of great importance."

Attempt to Improve Laws. "Our boiler law is very defective," said Mr. Brown, "and it is necessary to have a law which will give the inspector the power to make a preliminary visit to a factory before the boiler is put in operation."

When Act is Defective. A. G. C. Dinick, managing director of the Canadian Canners and Packers Association, said in his report: "The present boiler law is defective in many respects."

Leading manufacturers from every province in the Dominion, and representative of almost every line of industry, in constant touch with the questions affecting the material welfare and progress of all the provinces and of the Dominion as a whole, we are in a position to speak with some authority as to the trade policy best suited to the interests of the Dominion.

Canada First. Our first duty, unquestionably, is to our own country. We must have a tariff which will give us the best protection for those who live within the borders of the Dominion, and who are the backbone of the country generally, and who pay towards the administration of the affairs of the Dominion.

With regard to the Mother Country, while we are naturally of the opinion that a tariff should be imposed on imports from Great Britain, it should be remembered that the Mother Country, and also to any other country, is a matter of great importance.
