DIVIDING THEIR MISSION WORK  
Methodist Conference Settles the Question—Choose Two Secretaries.

Montreal, Sept. 21.—The question of dividing Methodist home and foreign missions was finally decided at the session of the Methodist General Conference this morning. The committee, which met after the notable debate yesterday, recommended the appointment of one board over the fund, with two departments, one for home and one for foreign missions, with a general secretary over each, with equal authority, who were to consult with the board or executive to arrange matters as circumstances required. There are to be two field secretaries, and the treasurer is to be a layman. The point yielded by the majority of the committee was leaving the details to the mission board.

Mr. N. W. Rowell, K. C., Toronto, moved the adoption of the report, and Rev. Dr. Sutherland, who has taken such a prominent part in the debate, was the seconder. The motion was agreed to.
