MISTOOK MCBRIDE FOR SIR WILFRID
Conference Clergyman Furnishes Good Story—Premier Leaves Victoria for Prince Rupert

VICTORIA, B. C., Aug. 19.—An interesting incident is related concerning a visiting Methodist clergyman, of the prairie provinces, who attended a garden party at Sir Wilfrid Laurier at the residence of the lieutenant governor this afternoon. Approaching a gentleman standing in a group the clergyman extended his hand. "I have long wanted to meet you, Sir Wilfrid," he observed. The recipient smiled and shook his head. "You will find the Canadian premier yet," he replied, indicating a figure across the lawn. "My name is McBride."

The warm interchange of courtesies between the Canadian and provincial premier is almost the sole topic of conversation. In response to an expression of the visiting newspaper man, who were entertained by the legislature in the press gallery at parliament buildings, Premier McBride said: "British Columbia regards it as a great privilege and a pleasure to greet the greatest Canadian. We put big things before small things. We are Canadians before politicians."

The premier reiterated the position taken at Vancouver concerning the problem of Asiatic immigration and labor, and spoke of Canada's naval policy as the first step in the nationhood of Canadians within the empire.

Referring to a published statement of the local Conservative member that in 1890 he had declared that not a man or gun should go to South Africa, Sir Wilfrid declared, amid a scene of wild enthusiasm: "My career is an open book. In no page can I find any such words as 'no man or gun'." On the contrary, the premier said he had gone to his constituents in Quebec and urged them to do for gratitude what their fellow British subjects did for enthusiasm.

The premier and party sailed at midnight by steamer George on their voyage north to Prince Rupert, where Sir Wilfrid speaks on Monday.
