

QUEEN SQUARE CHURCH DATES FROM YEAR 1791

History Recalled in Connection With Its 135th Anniversary

One next Sunday Queen Square United church will celebrate its 135th anniversary. It is the mother church of the former Methodist churches in Saint John, and the following interesting facts concerning it have been gathered by A. B. Gilman.

The organization dates from October, 1791. The first meeting was held in a house occupied by John Kelly, on the southeast corner of Princess and Charlotte streets. On Christmas Day, 1791, the little group took possession of and held an opening service within the first Methodist church in this city. It was a building in Germain street which had been vacated by the Episcopalians on the opening of old Trinity church. Here the Methodists worshipped for 17 years, and on Christmas Day, 1808, what is generally referred to as the old Germain street church was dedicated. In 1809 the Sunday school was organized, the first in the city.

CHURCH ENLARGED.

In 1883 the church was enlarged to 80 feet in length, with a gallery on four

so many sacred associations, until it was destroyed in the Great Fire of 1877. For a while they worshipped with Exmouth street church, then in Ring's hall, the upper flat of a building on the corner of Germain and Church streets. It was decided to move from Germain street to the present site, and the corner-stone of Queen Square church was laid on August 8, 1878. The school-room was dedicated on July 3, 1879. The congregation and Sunday school occupied the school until the opening of the church on October 5, 1879. On Christmas Day, 1881, the centennial of the church was celebrated, and in 1909 that of the Sunday school, with appropriate ceremony.

ANNIVERSARY FEATURES.

On next Sunday the preacher for the day will be Rev. Dr. Clarence MacKinnon, principal of the United Church College, Halifax. Dr. MacKinnon is a former moderator of the repletarian branch of the United church, and was the first president of the Maritime conference of the United Church. The choir will render music appropriate to the day. Rev. H. C. Rice, the present pastor, will conduct the service. On Monday evening there will be a congregational reunion, with a musical program and addresses. On Tuesday evening the Y. P. A. will have a program, and the observances will conclude on Wednesday evening with a prayer and praise service.

EACH PROVINCE HAS OWN LIQUOR SYSTEM

Intoxicating Drink Being Sold in Various Ways All Over Dominion

TORONTO, Oct. 22.—Premier Ferguson's appeal to the electorate of the Province of Ontario for return to power on a platform providing for important amendments to the Ontario Temperance Act, recalls the "infinite variety" of the respective liquor laws of the several provinces of Canada. The following is a brief synopsis:

Prince Edward Island: Liquor obtainable through Government vendor by medical prescription.

Nova Scotia: Liquor under Government control and obtainable through vendors by doctor's prescription.

New Brunswick: Sale of liquor controlled by Board of Commissioners. Sold through Government vendors on doctor's prescription. Vendors must purchase supplies from board.

Quebec: Government control administered through a commission and shops in non-local option districts. Commission is also wholesale buyer. Beer sold in taverns and beer and light wines in restaurants and hotels. Liquor shipped by express to individuals in province.

Ontario: Present law which the Ferguson Government seeks endorsement (amendment) Ontario Temperance Act, a prohibitory measure which permits the purchase of spirituous liquors under doctor's prescription. Beer of 44 strength on sale at tables in standard hotels and authorized restaurants. Manitoba: Liquor Control Act enacted in 1924. Sale by permit. Delivery to residence only. Prices fixed by Government Liquor Commission.

Saskatchewan: Liquor purchased from Government stores. In smaller rural centres there are stores for sale of beer only, subject to local option. Sales restricted to one quart per person per day of hard liquor; two gallons of beer.

Alberta: Sale of beer by glass in licensed hotels; sale of wine and spirits from Government vendors, and delivery of beer by brewer to permit holders' residences.

British Columbia: All persons 21 or over holding Government permit can purchase any quantity from Government vendors. Beer sold by the glass on licensed premises.
