


GOOD THINGS COMING TO THEATRES OF ST. JOHN

BRITISH TRADE WITH THE UNITED STATES

An Increase of About Half a Billion Shown For Eight Months. New York, Oct. 18.—During the month of August, according to figures published by the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, United States trade with the British Empire increased slightly, totalling for the principal countries \$399,768,000, against \$360,350,000 for the same month last year. For the eight months ending August the total was \$3,283,656,000, as compared with \$2,745,205,000 during the same period of last year.

Great Britain's trade balance continued to show marked improvement. Exports from the United States to the United Kingdom fell to \$119,305,000 for the month, and to \$1,259,292, for the eight months period, a decrease of over \$85,000,000 for the month as compared with August of last year, and of over \$289,000,000 for the eight months period.

GRAND JURY TO PROBE BOSTON FOOD PRICES

Boston, Oct. 20.—The federal grand jury was ordered in special session on Oct. 27 by United States Attorney-General Gallagher yesterday to decide whether present high prices for food at hotels and restaurants involve criminal profiteering. As an exhibit he indicated, the grand jury would be shown a ham sandwich which cost six cents to make and was sold for thirty cents.


