### NEW SALVATION ARMY WAR RESULTS, SAYS GIFFORD

(Boston Globe.)

"The old Salvation Army, whose outward symbols were the girl with the tambourine, the little groups on street corners with the big bass drum and distant trumpets, is no more," declared Col. Adam Gifford, provincial commander of the Salvationists in New England, at the special services in People's Temple yesterday afternoon.

He continued: "Out of the fires of war has come a new Salvation Army, still militant, still aggressive in the performance of helpful service, but a vaster force with a new dignity and a new esteem in the hearts of the American people. What the Salvation Army did on the battlefields of France is a story known to every American. The praise of the girl with the doughtnut has been sung by every returning doughboy.

"Before the war people with money in their pockets regarded the Salvation Army with good-natured contempt. They could not bring themselves to see any merit in the 'cheap' methods by which the audiences were attracted to the curbside evangelistic meetings. "Then the Salvation Army went to war. They went without much fuss, but the girls very quickly made plain what their mission was at the front. And the American people, always good sports, took back all the contemptuous digs they had made at the Salvation Army for more than five decades.

"The Salvation Army, in short, has come into its own. Everywhere there is a cry for its expansion. And the army has heeded the call and plans for work to overshadow the most far-reaching it has done in the past. To finance its work it will conduct a nation-wide campaign for \$13,000,000, which budgets show will be necessary for the rehabilitation of the army in this country."
