From a sermon in the hall of Washington, Chicago, May 21, 1893. It has been said that it is the greatest sacrifice one can make for a friend to give up one's life or one's love; to sacrifice one's life to lay down your own to find it in the good of another.

Do not now say I lift the standard too high. The standard of God cannot be lifted too high. The standard of truth must ever be high above the standards of the world, and the standard-bearers of truth must ever be in advance of the great march of the world before them.

And so, my sisters, do not falter; and when they cry, "The world is not ready for the world we have been educated up to your truth," call back to the world, "We cannot lower our standard to the level of the world. Bring your old world up to the level of our standard."

SIR WILFRID IN FINE FORM IN FIRST SPEECH

Mr. Borden Given a Neat Set Back in His Naval Policy Criticism—Premier Speaks on Reciprocity and Recent Bye-Election

Ottawa, Nov. 21—Hal. McGivern, M. P. of Ottawa, moved the address in the house today and Mr. Lapointe of Kamouraska seconded it. Mr. Borden followed. He said Sir Wilfrid had virtually bribed the west with promises of public works.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier followed, and in great fighting form. He declared that the one idea today was the question of better trade relations with the United States. There could be no greater agency for peace and good understanding between the United States and Great Britain, and nothing would better promote that than improved commercial relations.

A good commercial treaty would be of benefit not only to Canada but to the mother country as well. For years Canada had been seeking better commercial relations with her great neighbor, and now that better relations had been established there were many in Canada, and all of the opposition, who declared that they should not take a step to promote the abandonment of the preference which Canada had won in the world.

He said that the agreement with the United States would not involve the abandonment of the preference which Canada had won to Great Britain. It was true that the government had not followed the advice of the navy, which Mr. Borden had given last year, but had followed the advice of Mr. Borden given by year before.

The defeat in Drummond-Arthabaska had been referred to. Sir Wilfrid said that there were defects in which there was more honor than was won by the victory. This was one. It was not the naval policy of his majority's loyal opposition which the victory had been won by his majority's most disloyal opposition. It had been won by a remnant of the great Conservative party, and not by the young Liberal reactionaries who had found the Liberal principles too broad and too loyal for them.

Sir Wilfrid declared that the doctrine which had been preached by the victors in Drummond-Arthabaska was one which would not be tolerated in Canada, and would not be tolerated in the province of Quebec. We had a great and growing commerce which was developing to defend, and we have been developing a great nation which had assumed the responsibilities of a nation.

LANSLOWNE'S PLAN TO REFORM HOUSE OF LORDS

Will Move Resolutions Tomorrow—Lloyd-George Delivers Sparking Fighting Speech and Raps the Peers Hard—The Irish Question

London, Nov. 21—The lords presented their case to the country in the coming electoral struggle, a case which John E. Redmond, leader of the Nationalists, in a speech at Kingston tonight, characterized as "metaphorically committing suicide as fast as possible."

It is desirable that provision be made for settling differences that may arise between the house of commons and this house as reconstituted, reduced in number in accordance with the recent resolutions of this house.

That as to bills, other than money bills, such provisions should be made on the following lines: If a difference arises between the houses in regard to any bill, other than a money bill, in two successive sessions and during an interval of less than one year, and such differences are unable to be adjusted by other means, it shall be settled at a joint sitting composed of the members of the two houses, provided that the measure relates to a matter of great gravity, and has not been adequately submitted to the judgment of the people, it shall not be referred to a joint sitting, but submitted for decision to the electors by a referendum.

That as to money bills, the provision should be on the following lines: The lords are prepared to forego their constitutional right to reject and amend money bills which are of a purely financial character, provided effectual provision shall be made as to whether a bill or any of the provisions thereof are of a purely financial character, that question shall be referred to a joint committee of both houses with the speaker of the house of commons as chairman, and who shall have a casting vote only. If the committee holds that the bill or the provisions in question are not of a financial character, it shall be referred to the electors by a referendum.

THE TORREY MEETINGS

Judgment Day Subject Last Evening—Big Building Again Crowded

The interest in the mission being conducted by Dr. Torrey in the Queen's Hotel, continues as keen as upon the opening night and last evening the big building was again crowded to the doors. There was a larger representation of the city clergymen than usual and the address of the speaker was followed with close attention throughout. The members of the choir are also turning out loyally night after night and the singing is most inspiring.

The subject of Dr. Torrey's address tonight will be Hell. He declares that Hell is certain, that it is a place of both physical and mental suffering for which earthly torment is only a prelude. The great evangelist says he is merely delivering a message of Jesus Christ and gives biblical evidence for each of his assertions.

Before taking up his sermon last evening Dr. Torrey said he had heard it rumored that he had spoken contemptuously of the Church of England in a recent address. This he characterized as absolutely false. "As a matter of fact," he said, "I expressed my admiration for the beautiful collects. Our best supporters everywhere in England were members of the Church of England, including such men as the Bishop of London, the Bishop of Liverpool, the Bishop of Rochester and the chaplain general of the army. Great Frauds Charged

New York, Nov. 21—In a raid so important that Postmaster-General Hitchcock himself took charge, his inspectors fell on two concerns today which they charge with swindling the public out of more than \$400,000 by fraudulent use of the mails. Sheldon H. Burr, president of Burr Brothers; Eugene H. Burr, secretary and treasurer of the firm, and Frank H. Tobey, its vice-president, were arrested in the first raid and held in jail for \$40,000 each. The government charges that the firm sold between \$400,000 and \$500,000 in mining and oil stocks worth at a casting vote only.
