### Hooper's Busy Day.

New York, Sept. 14.—Harry Hooper of the Chicago White Sox stole Ruth's thunder yesterday. He hit two home runs, a single, drew a couple of bases on balls and scored four runs in the western team's 15th triumph over the Yankees this season. Hooper shared his brilliant performance with his team mate, Pitcher Dick Kerr, whose victory was the sixth in seven games he has pitched against the Yankees this season. New York's defeat ended Cleveland's cause in the American League pennant race. By winning from Philadelphia, the Indians narrowed New York's lead to five points. As both the Giants and the Pittsburgh Pirates won in the National League, their relative positions were not materially changed.
