Over \$30 but not exceeding \$40	20 cts
Over \$40 but not exceeding \$50	25 cts
Over \$50 but not exceeding \$60	30 cts
Over \$60 but not exceeding \$70	35 cts
Over \$70 but not exceeding \$80	40 cts
Over \$80 but not exceeding \$90	45 cts
Over \$90 but not exceeding \$100	50 cts

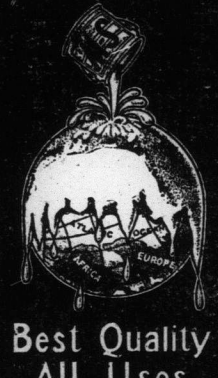

World Briefs

Roumania's credit holds firm. Her 5 per cent loan for \$24,000,000 was over-subscribed by \$16,000,000.

The temperature of Southern Australia varies not more than twenty degrees during the year.

The Sacred Bridge of Pekin, which a few years ago, no one was permitted to tread upon except the Emperor, is now freely used by the Chinese pedestrians.

Two thousand seven hundred dogs have been shipped by train from Paris to various parts of the front for the purpose of combating the plague of rats that troubled the French trenches.

Salmon fishing in Scotland is brisk this season, and in some districts ladies have taken to the craze. A Tangle, in six days' fishing, caught a salmon, weighing 511 lbs.

Announcement has been made that William Marconi will bring out shortly a new device which should put an end to danger of collisions between ships in darkness or fog. It is described as a simple contrivance, easily installed, which will be operated from the bridge of a ship.

No German officer or soldier allowed to aid Turkey until he enlisted in the Turkish army and donned the uniform of the Sultan's hosts. Enver Pasha says he will listen to advice from the Germans, but professes to take no commands from them.

Lake Tanganyika, which has been frequently mentioned of late in connection with General Smuts' campaign, is 2,700 feet above the sea. It is about 400 miles long, indented at each end so that steamers take three days to get from one end of the 400 miles to the other.

Lisbon, the capital of Portugal, has a population of about half a million. Its harbor is one of the finest in the world, and large enough to hold the navies of Europe. The greatest earthquake on record occurred at Lisbon when, in 1755, in less than ten minutes, the greater part of the city was made a heap of ruins, and 20,000 persons killed.

There are eighty-eight German and twelve Austrian ships in American ports with a total net tonnage of 308,479, lying idle on account of the war. The merchant ships may leave when they like, but warships must remain till the termination of the war. The reason why none of the merchantmen leave port is because the Allies maintain an effective patrol outside the three mile limit.

The Kurds, whose transfer of allegiance from Turkey to Russia in consequence of the fall of Ezerum is now alarming the official world at Constantinople, trace back not only to the Caraduchi of classical days, but far beyond that to the Turanian Kurds, who were a powerful nation in Assyrian times. When Nineveh fell they became merged in the Medes and up to today have been subject partly to Persia and partly to Turkey.

Italy's Queen narrowly escaped raiders who dropped bombs near the train on which Queen Helena and the Princesses Jolanda and Haralda were travelling. The royal party was on the way from a section of the front to Venice when the Austrian aeroplane made the attack. The lights in the train were extinguished and the railroad line was in darkness, but despite these precautions bombs fell on the line near the train breaking telegraph wire.

Many Indians Have Enlisted

It is said that after the war is over the Indians who have served at the front will demand the white man's privilege of voting, and it will probably be handed to them.

I forgot where I was, jumped up, and shouted and waved my hat, and hardly knew I was being fired at. It was one of the keenest feelings of enjoyment I have ever experienced.'"

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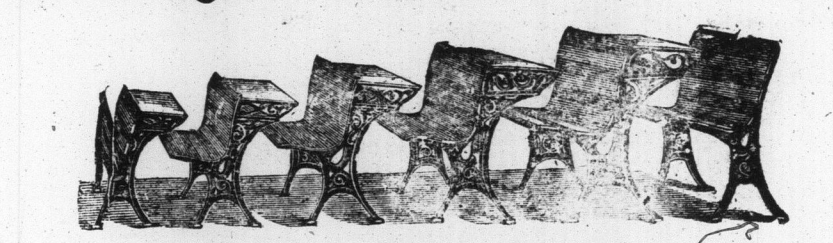
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This illustration shows Double Desks with Double Seats, each accommodating two pupils. Double Desks can also be supplied with Individual Seats, each seat rising independent.

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
