MONTENEGRO PROTESTS Against demands of European Powers to evacuate Scutari.

LONDON, April 28.—The representatives of the Montenearin Government in London received instructions from Cettinje ordering them to protest formally against the demand of the European Powers for the immediate evacuation of Scutari by Montenegrins, which is described by the Government of King Nicholas as 'unjust and cruel.,' The demand of the European Powers is couched in the following terms: Powers is couched in the following terms:

"We have the honor to declare collectively to the Royal Government of Montenegro that the taking of the fortress of Scutari does not in any way modify the decision of the European Powers relative to the desimitation of the frontiers of Northern and Northeast Albaul, and consequently the city of Scutari must be evacuated, with the briefest possible delay, and must be handed over to the European Powers, represented by the commandants of the International naval forces lying before the Montenegrin coast. The Royal Government of Montenegro is invited to give a prompt reply to this communication."

The Montenegrin representative in London, to whom this demand was cabled back from Cettinje, said to-day: back from Cettinje, said to-day:
"I have been ordered by my Government
to protest formally against this unjust
and gruel demand, and one more to ask
the European Ports to examine in an
equitable manufacture, the vital question of
Montenegro's future, and to place that
