ARRIVAL OF ONE OF THE HEAVIEST MEN IN THE WOBLD.

BANGOR, Me., July 17 .- Among the passengers arriving here on the Penobscot yesterday was John Craig, wife, child, and maid-The last three are ordinary persons so far as outward appearances go, but as regards Mr. outward appearances go, but as regards Mr. Craig himself there are some peculiar features. In the first place he tips the beam to the tune of over 800 pounds. In the next place he is nearly six and one-half feet high. These two physical attributes prevented Mr. Craig from entering, much less occupying, an ordinary state room, providing the berth would support him, and night before last, while on his way to to Rockland from Portland, he occupied a considerable portion of the floor of the saloon of the Richmond.

Mr. Craig at his birth weighed eleven pounds, at two years of age two hundred and six, and has been growing ever since, in weight at least. He took the first prize at Barnum's first baby show in 1848, and at the centennial was presented with a medal by his brethren, as being the heaviest Knight of Pythias, Udd Fellow and member of the Independent Order of Red Men in the world.

He measured 1½ feet around ankle, 2 feet 1 inch around calf of leg, 2 feet 5 inches around knee, 5½ feet around the thigh and about the same around the chest. When Mrs. Craig wants to cut John a suit of clothes, she just goes down to some wholesale store and buys him 37½ yards of cloth, and has to knit up 2½ pounds of yarn for a pair of warm socks. His wife is a Zulu, born in Borneo, Island of Circassia, northeast part of Asia, in the Black Ses. His intention is to exhibit himself here for a few days and then go to Bar Harbor for the season. There may be "bigger" men, as the world rates men, at Bar Harbor this season, but none heavier than John Craig, the Kentucky fat man.
