**SAY TWO CATALONIAN INVENTED BIG GUNS**  
Madrid Press Gives Spaniards Credit—Working for the Krupps Since 1916.

Madrid, Mar. 28.—The Madrid press is claiming for two catalonian Spaniards the credit for the invention of the long-range gun which has been bombarding Paris. These Spaniards are declared to have been working for Krupps on the invention since 1916.

The inventors, according to the press accounts, offered the invention to Spain and then to the allies, but in neither case met with a favorable response.

The German consulate at Barcelona, however, is said to have investigated the invention and sent the men to Germany in a submarine after purchasing the idea.

## TORONTO BLUES

**OUTPLAYED IN EVERY ANGLE**

**Vancouver Won Fourth Game by Score of 8 to 1—Fifth Game to Decide Championship Will Be Played Tomorrow Night.**

Toronto, March 28.—Outplayed at every angle, the Toronto Blues, N. H. L. champions, went down to an 8 to 1 defeat in the fourth game of the series tonight, before the smallest crowd of the series, necessitating a fifth game to decide the championship on Saturday night. It will be played under eastern rules, and the Toronto, though they were beaten badly tonight are confident that they will reverse the result and bring the Stanley Cup east.

Tonight's match was played under the western code, and the visitors practically outplayed the locals. It was not their night. They could not apparently do anything right, while the millionaires could not do anything wrong. On the Defensive.  
This brought Mr. Tweeddale to his feet. He declared that he had a good understanding of his departmental bills and assured the House that as a Minister of Agriculture he was the right man in the right place. He contended that the former government had allowed the cheese and butter industry in the province to deteriorate to such an extent that at the present time New Brunswick could not produce cheese fit for food.

Mr. Potts said that even if Mr. Tweeddale accurately represented the condition it was very poor advertising for the province to spread broadcast the statement that New Brunswick could not produce cheese. His opinion of the bill was that it was ridiculous.

The sole head of a family, or any male over 16 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and has resided in Canada, or was a subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for District. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence and cultivation of land in each of three years.

In certain districts a homesteader may secure additional quarter-sections as pre-
