To-day a party of us visited the Divisional Clearing Station, where the men of the —th Division are bathed, have their clothes thoroughly washed and disinfected, and are given a completely fresh outfittunic, trousers, shirt, vest, pants, and socks. The building is an old bleaching station, but has been largely refitted. A regular army of women are employed in the laundry, one of the most important parts of which is the ironing room, which proves the cemetery of most of the eggs of the lice. These bathing places have had a wonderful effect on the health of the troops. You need to be really dirty for a few weeks before you can understand anything of the delight of being clean.
