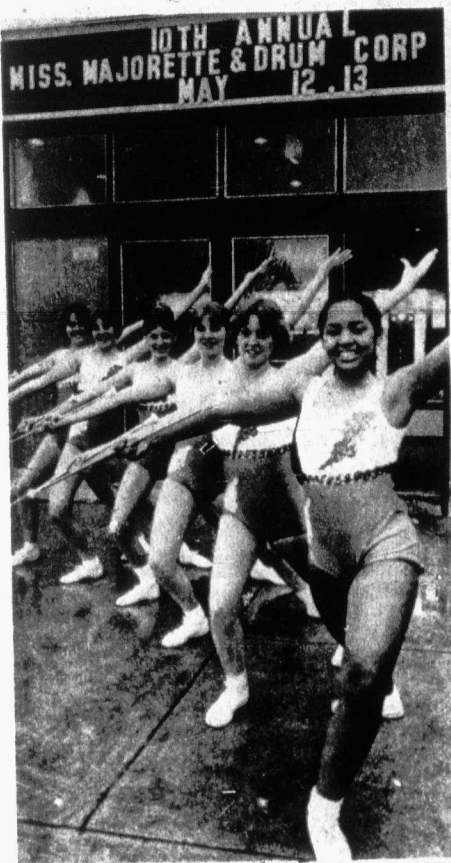

PUBLIC NOTICE

NOTICE OF APPLICATION BY THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF MISSISSAUGA TO DISPENSE WITH A VOTE OF THE ELECTORS

TAKE NOTICE THAT:

1. The Council of the Corporation of the City of Mississauga intends to apply to The Ontario Municipal Board for approval of the works referred to in Schedule "A" hereto, to an estimated cost in respect of each work as shown in such schedule and that the sum of \$550,000.00 shall be raised by the sale of debentures payable out of the general rate over a period not exceeding ten (10) years, and that the sum of \$1,116,000.00 shall be raised by the sale of debentures payable out of the general rate over a period not exceeding twenty (20) years.
2. Application will be made to The Ontario Municipal Board for an order to dispense with the assent of the electors to the undertaking of the said works. Any ratepayer may, within twenty-one (21) days after the first publication of this notice, send by post prepaid to the Clerk of the City of Mississauga, at the address given below, a notice in writing stating his objection to such approval and the grounds of such objection.
3. The Ontario Municipal Board may order pursuant to the statute that the assent of the electors shall not be required and may approve of the said works, but before doing so it may appoint a time and place for a public hearing when any objections will be considered.

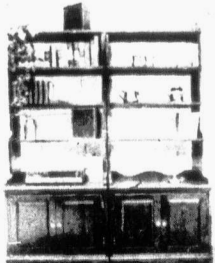

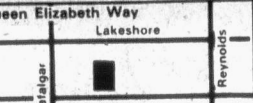
