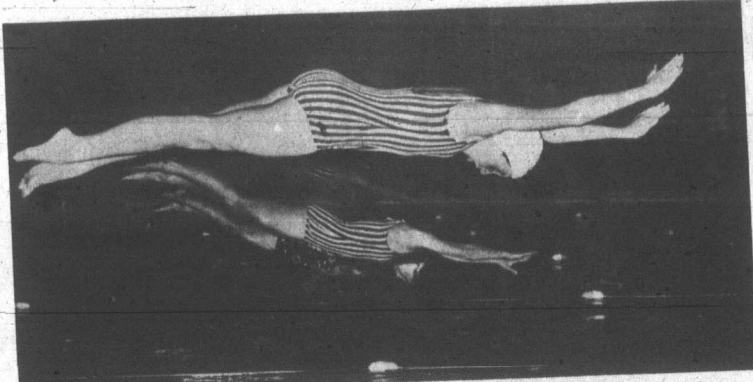

Two games, two wins and six points — that's the perfect record of Mississauga PCO's junior C team after Sunday's home opener at Malton Arena.

Playing their only game of the season against a robust Point Edward team — one of three western Ontario Lacrosse Association sides playing inter-locking games against Central circuit foes — coach Fred Moore's go-go GAF youngsters ended up on the winning side of an 11-10 score, thus earning a quartet of points (each inter-locking

game with four points) to vault into first place.

GAF's nursed an 11-7 advantage with only four minutes remaining until the final buzzer, but when it finally sounded, its welcome buzz got nearly drowned out by a united sigh of relief from the ranks of the hosts titering on the brink of disaster.

"We picked up three penalties in the last minutes and that made it tough," said manager Jim Halliday.

Glen Rogers and Dan Clarke each contributed

three points to GAF's winning cause via single goals and double assists. Ricky Halliday, Jerry Overboom and Dave Taylor scored twice each, while singles came from Keith Fillmore, Fred Moore and Bob Walker.

Andy Bartnik was in goal. Manager Halliday said he was pleased with the result.

GAF's are playing back-to-back away games against defending junior C titlist Long Branch (today) and Rexdale (Sunday) before returning to Malton Arena to host Bolton next Wednesday.

for basketball (by vote of other Toronto-area coaches); the Toronto Telegram award and coach of the year title for 1967 in football. During that memorable year Lavelle not only took a five-year losing team to the North York championships, but also went undefeated.

A strong believer in learning from the best, Lavelle has been responsible for clinics that brought top-notch sports figures like Bob Cousy, John Wooden, Ray Berry and Zeke Bradkowski

to Ontario for seminars. Now he's working on basketball star John Havlicek of the Boston Celtics.

His coaching approach is marked by what he calls "three basic points" — conditioning, fundamental skills supported by a great team spirit.

In building an OUA-calibre hoopla force, both Lavelle and Crichton consider it of prime importance to establish strong ties with the Mississauga area.

"We are hoping to recruit a team built on students from this area," said Crichton.

It's no secret around the campus that Peel high school stars like TL Kennedy's "Prince Henry" Vandenberg or Erindale Raiders' classy Shawn Dunn are considered by Erindale Warriors as a duo (together with a slate of other secondary school standouts) that would fit the "local identity" aspirations to perfection.

Crichton said he plans to visit Peel-Halton area high schools within the "next few weeks".

Quartet without loss of point in Lakeshore Industrial soccer loop

Only four teams remain with unblemished record after the first two weeks of competition in the 10-club Lakeshore Industrial Soccer League.

Kumil won its opening game, blanking Forrest Albion 4-0, to join two-game winners Pony, Malton United and Mimico Rangers in the select group of unbeaten squads.

Pony caused an upset with a narrow 2-1 conquest of defending champion Goodyear. The result propelled Pony to the top of the loop with four points but a superior goal average over Malton and Mimico.

Malton beat new entry Toronto Star 6-2 and Mimico triumphed over Peel County 4-0.

A torrential downpour shortly after the start of the second half marred the Goodyear-Pony game at St. Lawrence Park in Port Credit. Pony was ahead 2-0 at the time and with Goodyear trying to stage a comeback, but the slippery conditions didn't help. Pony outside-left Frank McCarthy opened the score 15 minutes into the game when he headed across from Harry Caldwell just under the crossbar.

Five minutes into the second half centre John Wright increased the margin after a shot which hit a bump in the goal mouth and eluded Goodyear keeper Marshall Gorrie who had appeared to have it covered. With 15 minutes to go, Goodyear got one back from outside-left John Dornan who headed

home a Liam Cahill corner kick.

Goodyear applied strong pressure for the tying goal with inside right Jimmy Canovan hitting the crossbar on two occasions, but great goalkeeping by Bobby Taylor saved the day.

Kumil's inside-right Paul Dowhaluk had a hand in all of his team's goals in the 4-0 shutout of Forrest Albion.

After a slow start Mimico Rangers overcame a much-improved Peel County side and emerged 3-1 victors. Striker Mike North, inside-left Jerry Shaw and outside-left Billy Dixon scored for Rangers while centre Walter Fabic hit for Peel.
