Sir,

Nos. 2, 3 & 9, in the last Quarterly Report are omitted, as they are withdrawn from the school. N^o. 1, has not returned but is expected daily. N^o. 6, is sick at his home with the scarlet fever.

N^o. 9, having made several attempts to abscond, and being a very unpromising boy with no apparent capacity for enlargement, I have allowed him to return with one of the parents of the Indian Boys. I was urged to do that through fear that he would escape and be frozen on the road.

The boy No. 7 arrived here in the scarlet fever, and has been at the point of death. My family have remained by his bed during the whole of the last four nights. I was obliged to procure medical aid to preserve his life: he is in a separate apartment, and as the fever is removed, he is likely to recover.
