

Prélud of Canada or of the Legions of the respective provinces according to the authority of the Prélat or of that Legion under this Act.

The framers of the B. & C. Act intended that in the main the administration of justice should be through the medium of these provincial courts thus continued.

Sec 107 B. & C. Act provides that "the full of law may from time to time provide for the const. maintenance and organization of a general court of appeal for Canada, and (it was established 1876) and for the establishment of any additional courts for the better administration of the laws of Canada." The jurisdiction of such additional courts must be a special jurisdiction limited to cases arising out of those matters only which are within the competence of the Dominion Prélat. The Dominion is so limited except in the case of its "General Court of Appeal" - the Supreme Court of Canada.

The only additional courts established by the Dominion for are, the Exchequer Court of Canada and the Maritime Court of Ontario, each with a specially limited jurisdiction.

Any court may take advantage of the actual practice

Ex parte Anderson. Cert of 2. B. Why decided - creation of middle legislative and judicial courts in Canada did not take away original jurisdiction of Courts at West-
minster - (See notes on Int Law)

Legality of cert. held that a crime in one city should be considered crime in the other. also minority of cert. Justice held conditions should be considered.

It was cert of 2. B. in England on appeal that issued writ of Habeas Corpus. Quantum Cert of Common Pleas had discharged him & no further action was taken. Stat. VII. put an end to the practice claimed in this case by cert of 2. B. in England.

The power of forb. per under Sec 96 does not apply to persons appointed under common law as he reconciled with Sec 27, 1891 & S. 14 of 92.

Green v. Bertram (1 P. C. 6120)

in all cases criminal and civil the authority had not been forfeited with it is the inherent right of Crown to exercise an appellate jurisdiction.
