NOTE:

This suggested redistribution indicates a saving of 32 of staff, and is principally due to re-grouping of the work in Secretary's Department, and Immigration Service. It is a matter of concern to the Superintendent of Immigration that his outside staff is in many offices "marking time" on definite orders from Ottawa, but I am certain that by re-grouping and dismissal of say 20 of staff, the sum thus saved could be expended in advertising, and replies handled in most cases by correspondence from the new centres.

I recommend redistribution of Secretary's work, which I am satisfied is practicable with new premises. The centralization of accounting will make possible a reduction of finance staff in all Divisions.
