I am enclosing cppy of letter from Mr. Rothery of Frenchman's Butte, Sask., and I wish you would let me have a statement as to your attitude on the question referred to. It would be a good idea to write Mr. Rothery direct, as well.

These people in Northern Saskatchewan are working under heavy handicaps and must receive every consideration possible. The Liberals have done nothing for them during the past four years. We must be prepared to assist them.

I should like also if you could let me have something definite re. the Hudson's Bay Railway. Are the Conservatives, if returned, prepared to proceed with the work on the remaining 92 miles? Even if a start is made it will satisfy our people that the work will ultimately be completed.

The Grits have done nothing towards completing it; the Progressives' had an opportunity to force the Government but did not do so; the people now look to us to give them some assurance. I hope we can do it.
