

Ottawa, October 17th, 1933.

Dear Sir:-

In reply to your letter of the 21st September to Mr. Avrey, I wish to inform you that Paylists show that Annuity for the Years 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933 for Mary Wawashkung, presumably Mary Ward, No.166 Osnaburgh Band, was paid at the time of distribution to Joseph Shaywaishkung, No.101 Osnaburgh Band. If this Indian does not deliver this money to her I wish you would advise me in order that steps may be taken to force him to pay over the money which he owes her.

While writing to you I wish also to refer you to relief accounts as submitted by you. It is the Department's desire that all relief accounts should be submitted for Calendar Months only and not overlap. Do not submit accounts showing supplies given partly in one month and partly in another.

I might also add that arrangements will be made to meet the Cariboo Lake Indians next Summer at Hikip where the Treaty was made and where the Indians so strongly desire to be paid.
