With reference to the application forwarded by you on the 18th instant for the withdrawal of the savings of Corbett or Guthbert George, I beg to inform you that the original deposit for this boy was made under the name of Guthbert George or Scuin and owing to the difficulty referred to in the third paragraph of my letter to you of the 18th instant the Department will await your reply before dealing with the application. As stated in that letter there are two separate entries in the Statement of Annuities to be funded for 1901 viz:- Corbet Scuin and Guthbert George. Both are given as No. 49 St. Boniface School, but the Band numbers vary being respectively 147 Berens River Band and No. 19 same Band.

On the application for withdrawal Corbett George is quoted as No. 46 St. Boniface and 147 Berens River

Kindly report fully on the points at issue as the application is otherwise satisfactory. The Department is anxious that these applications should be dealt with promptly.
