SECRET AND PERSONAL

Following for the Prime Minister from the Prime Minister.

Your telegram No. 217. I can only conclude that my telegram No. 239 was garbled in transmission. It contained no suggestion that I might issue "a public statement that Canadian troops shall not be used in Greece"nor have I had any intention so to do. What I said was that I had given an assurance that Canadian forces should not be sent there without the consent of the Canadian Government. That is a very different matter which is open to no objection and does not increase your difficulties. I do not see how as head of the Canadian Government when asked in parliament, as I was, for such an assurance I could have taken a different line. I hope to avoid any further public statement on this matter and I am glad to learn of the orders issued to

Field Marshal Alexander.
