

c) Frequency Shift Required to Implement CBC Plans:

<u>Station</u>	<u>Location</u>	<u>Request</u>
CJCJ	Calgary, Alta.	The CBC requests that the frequency of CJCJ be changed <u>from</u> 1230 kc <u>to</u> 1240 kc.

Reason: To avoid adjacent channel interference with CJOC, Lethbridge, on 1220 kc. This latter change of frequency is to permit the use of 1010 kc channel by the CBC for a high-power station in Alberta.

B. APPLICATIONS RECOMMENDED FOR REJECTION:

IT WAS RESOLVED

THAT the Minister of Reconstruction be advised that the Board of Governors of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation recommends that the following applications be denied for the reasons indicated:

a) For Changes to Existing Stations:

<u>Station</u>	<u>Location</u>	<u>Request</u>
CFCY	Charlottetown, P. E. I.	Radio link <u>from</u> Pictou County, N.S. <u>to</u> Charlottetown PEI to carry remote programs.

Reason: It is technically undesirable to permit such an installation as it would duplicate existing wire facilities and also encroach on the areas of existing stations.

b) For New Stations:

<u>Applicant</u>	<u>Station Location</u>	<u>Request</u>
Chilliwack Broadcasting Co. (CHWK)	Mission City, Abbotsford, B.C.	250 watts on 1490 kc.
Eric C. Aylen (Trail, B.C.)	Cranbrook, B.C.	250 watts on 1400 kc. and network connection.

Reason: Applicant has withdrawn his application.

Reason: Mr. Aylen stated that the establishment of this station depended upon basic affiliation with a CBC network; the applicant further requested that the CBC low-power relay transmitters at Cranbrook and Kimberley be closed down. The financial statement submitted was unsatisfactory, in that Mr. Aylen would not have control of the proposed company.
