SHIPPING INTELLIGENCE.

ELVER'S CLOCK.—Two barks and one brig are announced by telegraph.
 Capt. Beaver, of H. M. Brig Pantaloon, arrived this morning, states that he saw a great number of vessels coming up.

The bark Scotia, arrived yesterday, has on board 14 passengers and 6 of the crew of the bark Navaria, wrecked on Matia.

The schooner sent to the wreck of the Airthey Castle, of Anticosti, about the latter end of April, to ascertain whether she could be raised, returned to port yesterday, and the Captain reports that she cannot be raised. We understand that another will be despatched to the wreck to bring up the anchors, chains, &c.

It is said that there are two schooners wrecked off Anticosti, one laden with fish and the other in ballast.

We understand that Mr. Mann's large steamship will be launched on Wednesday morning next, about 7 o'clock. Her rigging, &c., arrived this morning in the bark Scotia, from Greenock.
