Clerks of the peace to tranfof the affeffments to the clerk of house of affem-Uly.

X. And be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the Clerk of init an account the Peace in each and every Diffrict in this Province shall, and he is hereby required to transmit before the end of the Month of November in every year, the to the Clerk of the House of Assembly for the time being, an aggregate account of the laid Afsefsment, which thall contain a true and full flatement of every species of property in respect of which, such Alselsment was made; and the Clerks of the Peace respectively, are hereby authorized to demand, and the Treasurer of each District, is hereby respectively required to pay to each of the faid Clerks of the Peace for their trouble in making up fuch aggregate : account, the fum of twenty finilings.

Compensation to the collector.

XI. And be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaids. That the Collector may deduct at the rate of five Pounds for every hundred Pounds, & no more, as a full compensation for his service in collecting, any law to the contrary notwithstanding, and the Treasurer thall give a Receipt for all money paid tohim by any Collector.

Treasurer to be appointed by the juffices at their Quarter Sefuons.

XII. And be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid. That it shall and may be lawful for the faid Juffices, at their respective general. Quarter Seffions assembled, or the greater part of them then and there assembled, to nominate and appoint a proper perform, being relident in the laid Diffrict, to be treafurer of the faid Diffrict, which treasurer shall give fufficient fecurity in fuch. fums as shall be approved of by the faid Juffices, at their refpective general. Quarter Settions then and there assembled, to be accountable for the feveral funs of money which shall be refpectively paid to him in purfuance of this Act, and to pay fuch fum or fums of money as shall be ordered to be paid by the Juffices in their general Quarter Seffions, and also for the due and faithful execution of the truft reposed in him, and all and every such sum or sums. of money as shall be paid into his hands by virtue of and in purfuance of this Act, shall be deemed and taken to be the public flock of the Diffrict, and the faid treaturer shall, and is hereby required to pay to much of the money inhis hands, to fuch perfor or performs as the faid Justices at their respective general Quarter Sofficients or the greater part of them, then and there assembled, shall by their orders direct and appoint for the purpoles herein recited, and for any other uses and purposes to which the public stock of any District, is or shall be applicable by Law, referving at all and every time or times, to and for his own use, and as a reward for his labour and expence, the fum of three pounds for every hundred pounds that shall or may be paid into his hands by, the faid Collectors for the purposes aforefaid.

Duty of the Treafures.

XIII. And be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the faid. treaturer shall, and he is hereby required to keep books of entries of the feveral fums respectively received and paid by him in purfuance of this Act, and also to deliver in a true and exact account upon Oath (if required,) which. Oath, any one of the Jultices at their respective general Quarter Sellions is hereby authorized to administer; of all and every sum or sums of money respectively received and paid by him, diftinguishing the particular uses to which luch lum or lums of money have been applied, to the Juffices at every general,
