## SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS

The sole bona fide family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required where residence is performed in the vicinity.

The stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may present a written section alongside his homestead. Price \$20 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years, after earning homesteaded money, also 60 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead cost on certain conditions.

Widder who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$300 per acre.

Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, and erect a house worth \$200.

## TEUTON LITERARY HUN ARMY

President Poincaré Makes Appeal For Action Against Wide Circulation of German Publication

By Courier Leased Wire.  
Paris, March 12.—"Our enemies made war on us through their bene and as well as through their commerce and finance, without a formal declaration," said President Poincaré at the Sorbonne yesterday afternoon in addressing the Book Congress. "This was the first assembly since the war of this association of publishers, writers, artists, printers, which formerly held annual meetings. The gathering was to give expression to the determination of French literary and publishing circles to protect themselves against encroachments after the war."

German Spokesman  
"The German book," said M. Poincaré, "was the spokesman of German care, as well as of German pride and culture. At times it invaded France with noisy brutes at others with insinuating hypocrisy in the hands of too penetrating even university and high schools."

Invasion  
The President talked of the long number of Prussian, Saxon and Bavarian publications, often in French language, that had followed their way to France, comprising works on international law, which Germany sought to teach President referred to what he called the audacity of Germans flooding Paris with cheap detective and fashion magazines, printed in French and bearing French titles which he said, "gave us lessons in French grace meditated on the banks of the Spree."
