CANADIAN OFFICERS PUNISHED BY ENGLISH COURT MARSHAL

London, Feb. 8—The following notices were gazetted tonight:

Captain John Gordon Gray, 6th Canadian Mounted Rifles, is dismissed from the service by sentence of a general court martial passed January 16th.

Lieutenant Charles Morton, of the Canadian Force, is fined £50 for parading at Salisbury wearing a Victoria Cross and the uniform of a lieutenant-colonel without authority. He was also committed for trial on charges of fraud. Lieutenant Morton was arrested in a Salisbury bank. He escaped from the constable, but was recaptured after a chase.

Ottawa, Feb. 9—Major Smith, of the Princess Patricia's has been relieved of his command. He is from Chicago, and it is alleged made certain derogatory references to Canadians. He is also said to have been named in connection with a Montreal divorce case, listed for hearing before the senate committee this session.

(It is unfortunate for Canada that a few of her overseas officers are unable to sustain the reputation of her gallant men who have won undying fame in the trenches. Surely the cases already dealt with will be a warning to others.)

Capt. Gray was well liked by his men here, where he has many friends who greatly deplore the causes which led to his being dismissed from the service.—Windsor Tribune.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

Settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months out of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.

The act of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
