THE MILL STRIKE.

The expected has happened. Each year, for many years past, the cost of rent and the prices of the necessities of life have increased at a much faster rate than has the wages of the workmen.

The only surprise manifested at the men's demands is occasioned by the extreme modesty of their claims. Three-quarters of those who are asking an increase of wages demand only \$1.75 a day; and only seven of the twenty-four stipulate for as much as \$3.00 a day.

Public opinion will be strongly in favor of the granting of all that the men ask. Their claims are just. If they have made any mistake, it is in asking too little.

Hitherto those who work in the mills have had no organization, no union among themselves, no central body with authority to speak for them.
