REAL GOLD PRICES. Kiln Erected on Ancient Gold Mine in India.

Gold bricks, real ones, may be the meens of restoring the ancient frame of Golconda, near Hyderabad, in southern India, once known all the world over for its gold mines, but now a decayed city. The natural jits from which many centuries ago the precious metal was extracted have in course of time filled up with water. A contractor recently obtained permission to make bricks near the place and ten kilns were erected. The first finished bricks aroused curiosity by their yellowish tint, and analysis proved that they contained gold dust. On the basis of the yield of the sample bricks, the ten kilns will aggregate in weight about 12,857 pounds of gold worth over \$50,000,000.
