where the poll is being held; shall declare his name, surname, and addition.

Each elector, if required by the Deputy Returning Officer, the Poll Clerk, one of the Candidates, or one of their agents shall, before receiving his bal-lot papers, take an oath of qualifica-ant Road; thence eastwardly along tion. The voter is to vote only for one candidate for Mayor and for six and thence to the Northern limit of After receiving the ballot papers

the voter shall go into one of the compartments and with a pencil, there provided, place a cross in the division containing the name of the candidate for Mayor, and the six candidates for Councillors, for whom he intends to vote, thus-X.

The voter will then fold each ballot paper, so as to show a portion of the back only, with the initials of the Deputy Returning Officer, and shall hand them so folded up to the Deputy Returning Officer, and the Deputy Returning Officer shall, without unfold ing them, ascertain that they are the ballot papers which he furnished to the elector, and then immediately place them in the Ballot Box. The voter shall forthwith leave the Pollin

If a voter inadvertently spoils ballot paper, he may return it to the Deputy Returning Officer, who will

If a voter votes for more candidates than he is entitled to vote for, or places any mark on the ballot papers by which he can afterwards be identified, his vote will be void and will not

If a voter takes a ballot or ballot paper out of the Polling Station, or fraudulently puts any other paper into the Ballot Box than the papers given him by the Deputy Returning Officer, he will be subject to punishment by a fine of Five Hundred Dollars or by imprisonment for a time not exceeding six months, with one without hard labour.

Boundaries of Town!

For the purpose of this Act, the town of St. John's shall be held to be comprised within the following bound-aries or limits, hereinafter described as the town limits, viz.:

Commencing at Chain Rock, thence in a straight line to the northeast corner of Deadman's Pond; thence in a straight line to the northeast angle of the Penitentiary grounds; thence the northwest angle of the Roman Catholic Cemetery; thence in a straight line to Allendale Bridge, not nclusive; thence in a straight line to the bridge over Mundy Pond Brook, not inclusive, on the Mundy Pond Road; thence following the said road to its junction with Hamilton Street; in a straight line to Syme's Bridge, not inclusive; and thence in straight line to the Quarry on the South Side Hill known as Cuddihy's Quarry; thence in a straight line to Fort Amherst and thence to the place

No. 1 Division :- All that part of the Town east of the King's Wharf; thence following the centre of the King's Beach, King's Road, Rennie's Mill Road, to the Northern limit of

No. 2 Division:-From the Western bounday of No. 1 division to the centre of Baird's Cove up Market House Hill, Cathedral Hill, Garrison Hill and Long Pond Road, to the Northern

No. 3 Division:—From the Western bounday of No. 2 division to the centre of Goodridge's Western Wharf, up Lime Street to LeMarchant Road; along LeMarchant Road, eastwardly, to Cookstown Road and Freshwater Road to the Northern limit of the

Town. No. 4 Division:-From the Western boundary of No. 3 division to the Eastern boundary of Newman's water-side premises; thence up to the cen-LeMarchant Road to Pennywell Road, the Town.

No. 5 Division:-All that part of the Town situate West of the West-ern boundary of No. 4 division and North of the Waterford Bridge Road. No. 6 Division :- All that part of the John's Harbor, extending from Fort Amherst to Syme's Bridge. jun26,28


