Latest reports just to hand
from the superintendent of op-
erations at the property, show
that excellent results have been
obtained to date, and that at
the present time work is pro-
gressing on a 6 ft. 4 in. seam of
coal, with 1 ft. 4 in. of mixed
coal on the hanging wall. The
seam is well defined, and from
expert opinion there is every
indication that by the time the
tunnel has been driven for 100
to 150 feet, a solid 6 foot seam
of coal will have been opened
up. The results thus far attain-
ed are from work performed on
the Jukes seam.
So far as investigations in the
areas have been prosecuted, the
conditions and occurrence of
coal in the series appear to be
almost identical with those of
the Sydney areas. The best
seams in Sydney only average 6
feet in thickness.
