From a recent Magazine we have copied the following. We only need to add, Papers to suit all requirements can be had at our Store.

1. Thou shalt heed the call of Plain quiet wall papers and white woodwork wherever such is possible.
2. Thou shalt lighten dark rooms by the use of light-hued, yellow-tinted wall paper, that suggests the blessed sunshine.
3. Thou shalt see that thy walls and thine own personality are not too forward, but modestly retiring.
4. Thou shalt use no large-patterned wall papers against which to hang thy pictures. The one will kill the other.
5. Thou shalt have no centerpiece or cornerpieces upon thy ceiling, but only a very nearly plain expanse of light color.
6. Thou shalt have thy fill of bright tints, and delicate designs for bedrooms and boudoirs, but for drawing-rooms, dining-rooms, libraries and halls, thou shalt be compelled to use less frivolous papers.
7. Thou shalt, when the ceiling is not too high, run the paper of the side wall up to the ceiling, putting the border just below the angle.
8. Thou shalt not panel the walls of a small room, except it be above a mantelpiece, a sideboard or a bookcase, where a bit of tapestry, a mirror or a picture may be held in place by strips of moulding.
9. Thou shalt use attention-compelling cut out borders, or conventionally designed strips for divisions between walls and ceiling.
10. Thou shalt remember at all times that thy wall paper is but a background against which to show thy pictures, thy furniture, and thy friends.

## English Railway Strike Threatened.

### Germany Seeking Loan From Argentine.

#### GERMANY RAISED MONEY.

BUENOS AIRES, Sept. 24. Formal negotiations were opened here yesterday by Germany for a loan of a hundred million dollars from Argentina to facilitate purchase of raw materials in this country.

#### THE BOLSHEVIST PROGRAMME.

STOCKHOLM, Sept. 24. Leon Trotsky, the Bolshevist Minister of War and Marine, speaking at Petrograd recently, gave a detailed programme of Bolshevist military operations, saying among other things that "it is not in Finland that an immense world combat against capitalism can be fought, but in Great Britain and America, and above all in the Far East."

#### RAILWAYMEN IN ENGLAND MAY STRIKE TO-DAY.

LONDON, Sept. 24. Another railway strike in Great Britain over the question of wages appeared to-day as a possibility through to-day's developments in the negotiations between representatives of the men and the Government. The executive body of railway men this morning sent an ultimatum to the Government, rejecting the standardization offer made by the latter, and intimating that unless a favorable reply was received by noon on Thursday, the men would be ordered to cease work.

#### RELEASING MAIL.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 24. The British Government has decided to release at once a great quantity of package mail held up in England during the war. This was announced to-day by the State Department.

#### PRINCE OF WALES PRIZE.

VICTORIA, B. C., Sept. 24. Last night, following the official dinner at Government House, the Prince of Wales was informed of the \$50,000 prize which Norman A. Yarrow, of Victoria, is offering for the first non-

stop airship flight across the Pacific Ocean, from Vancouver Island to Japan. His Royal Highness, on being informed, immediately signified his desire to be associated with the proposal, and the offer of Mr. Yarrow and his friends will now be known as the Prince of Wales' Prize.

#### CANADA'S TRADE.

OTTAWA, ONT., Sept. 24. While the value of Canada's imports for the five months of the fiscal year to August 31st totalled \$355,254,498, a decrease of \$46,808,236 compared with the same period last year, exports valued at \$747,448,689 show an increase of \$22,609,875 over last year.

#### REGARDING ALIENS.

OTTAWA, ONT., Sept. 24. Believing that injustice has been done their fellow countrymen, the Ukrainian and Poles, of Ottawa, urged the Government to try to release the seventeen aliens who were arrested in Ottawa and interned without trial in May, 1918, and who have since been prisoners in Kapekasking Camp. Hon. C. J. Doherty, replying to the delegation, said he was impressed with the representations made by the delegation and would take the matter into serious consideration. He added that he would take the matter up with the Immigration Department.

#### WILL MEET TO-DAY.

LONDON, Sept. 24. Following a conference between Sir Eric Geddes, the new Minister of Transportation, and Premier Lloyd George, it was announced that Sir Eric would meet the leaders of the railwaymen, Thursday morning.

#### A MISUNDERSTANDING.

LONDON, Sept. 24. The Government has sent a communication to the officers of the National Union of Railwaymen, declaring that there has been a misunderstanding, and agreeing to further negotiations. It is understood this action followed a meeting this afternoon of the

entire cabinet at which was considered an ultimatum by the railwaymen, threatening to strike on Friday at noon.
