## Major Cotton Here.

PLANE SLIGHTLY DAMAGED.

Major F. Sidney Cotton arrived in town by to-day's express from Botwood and will remain here for a few days. Major Cotton flew from Hawke Bay to Lomond Saturday morning, the distance of over 100 miles being covered in ninety minutes. The plane, which was considerably damaged, was seen from above. At Lomond, a quantity of pit props was bought. These pit props will be used to make up the full complement of the next load to be sent to England on S.S. Penare as the recent strike prevented sufficient timber from being cut at Hawke Bay. There are now 75 men cutting at that place and more will arrive shortly. Lomond was left at 11:30 a.m. Saturday. Major Hemming piloting the machine. In landing at Botwood, the plane met with a slight accident and will be laid up for about a month. Three new machines are now at Botwood. One is a Martinsyde, fitted with wireless telephone and all instruments, including electrical apparatus for use in flying through fog and clouds.
