

Britain Leads the Way—37 Naval Vessels to be Scrapped

Governor Pinchot's Proposals Rejected by Anthracite Operators—Lloyd George Declares He is Prepared to Retire—Parliament May Take Measures to Protect British Firm Industry.

REDUCING NAVAL STRENGTH.

LONDON, Dec. 2.—Thirty-seven British naval ships are to be scrapped in the immediate future, the Admiralty announced today. The vessels, which include three cruisers, five destroyers, eight destroyers, seven submarines, three trawlers and one minesweeper, are to be disposed of by the House of Commons.

ANTHRACITE STRIKE TO CONTINUE.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 2.—The anthracite strike, as the result of the operators' rejection of Governor Pinchot's peace plan, today appeared to have entered another period of marking time. The deadlock in the negotiations seemed so complete that President Lewis of the United Mine Workers left for home in Springfield, Ill., to take a rest.

THE FILM DISCUSSED IN THE COMMONS.

LONDON, Dec. 2.—The House of Commons today heard a version of a complaint often heard by British papers that the United States' motion pictures give an entirely false impression of British life and manners. Arthur Samuel, Parliamentary Secretary for Overseas Trade Department in response to a question, stated that the Government was considering the introduction of legislation compelling British theatres to include a certain percentage of British films in their programme so as to eliminate British production.

SPAN RETURNS TO CIVIL GOVERNMENT.

MADRID, Dec. 2.—Civilian Government, abolished by the A. L. Hucenas Ministry was restored by a military coup in September, 1923, has been restored in Spain. General Primo De Rivera, who was president of the Military Government, remains at the head of the Government as Premier. The return to civilian government came with remarkable suddenness this afternoon.

IRISH RECEIVES CONFIDENCE VOTE.

PARIS, Dec. 2.—Maurice Blandin, the new French Premier, who appeared before Parliament for the first time yesterday, secured early this morning a vote of confidence from the Chamber on his motion to proceed with the discussion of the financial bill. The vote was 113 against 113.

IRISH STATE AND ULSTER TO ARRIVE AT A SETTLEMENT.

LONDON, Dec. 2.—The Irish Boundary Commission's report will not be issued for the present. This announcement was made in the House of Commons today by Premier Baldwin, after consultation with President Cosgrave of the Free State and Ulster will themselves reach a settlement on a broad basis of the existing boundary.

ROME, Dec. 2.—The continuance of tempestuous weather is causing considerable damage as well as suffering among the people.
