# Prolonging Life.

Somewhat different advice must be given with regard to bodily exercises in their reference to longevity. In old age, the task cannot be thus shifted from one organ to another; the work allotted to each sufficiently taxes its strength, and vicarious action

cannot be performed without mischief. Hence the importance of maintaining, as far as possible, the equable action of all the bodily organs, so that the share of the vital processes assigned to each shall be properly ac complished. For this reason exercise is an important part of the conduct of life in old age; but discretion is absolutely necessary. An old man should discover by experience how much exercise he can take without exhausting his powers, and should be careful never to exceed the limit. Old persons are apt to forget that their stay ing powers are much less than they once were, and that, while a walk of two or three miles may prove easy and pleasurable, the addition of a return journey of similar length will seriously overtax the strength.
