British Columbia Politics. Lieutenant-Governor McInnes, of British Columbia, who, some 25 years ince, went from Dresden, Ont., to that Province, has had the unique dis-Unction during his two years incumbency of his high office, of having dismissed two ministries, and caused two crises in the management of public affairs.

The first occasion for his exercise of the power was when he dismissed the Turner Ministry, eighteen months ago. At that time Lieutenant-Governor Mc-Innes took the ground that his Minleters had lost the confidence of the Legislature, and that some of its members had been guilty of misrepresenting the proceedings with regard to certain warrants, which had been issued for the raising of money. When Lieutenant-Governor McInnes dismissed Mr. Turner, he did not send for the leader of the Opposition, but for Mr. Beaven, who had previously been Premier of the Province, but who had been defeated in the elections then just over. Mr. Beaven failed to form a Cabinet, and Mr. Semlin formed a Government. He took Hon. Joseph Martin, who had removed to British Columbia from Manitoba, into his Cabinet, and the new Administration got along moderately well till last summer when, after Mr. Martin's "break" at a Rossland dinner-an 2 only White Cambric Skirts, umepisode which has never been fully explained-there was a falling-out between the Premier and Mr. Martin, and the latter was compelled to leave the Cabinet.

No doubt the retirement of Mr. Martin from the Semlin Ministry weakened it, because, though the "stormy petrel" has many enemies in public life, he has not a few friends. He found, for a time, new adherents, who were anxious to use him to wreck the Semlin Administration. They had little love for Mr. Martin; but they had less for the Cabinet. It had been the means of passing the eight-hour bill and other measures that were held by many to be inimical to the progress of British Columbia, and it was with special delight that the opponents of these measures welcomed the assistance of Mr. Martin into the camp of the malcontents.

There were stormy times when the Legislature assembled last month; there were one or two desertions from the Government's none too large working majority; and early divisions, in which it was shown that the Government held office by a very slim thread, were gladly forced by the Opposition. The Government brought down a redistribution bill, and it was beaten by 19 to 18, among the 19 being the Hon. Jos. Martin. The Premier held a conference with his followers, and with some members who had been acting with the Opposition because of certain objectionshle features in recent legislation, and the result was that, though thus defeated by one majority, the Premier was able to announce that he could command a majority in the House, and was therefore able to continue in the government of the country.

The Lieutenant-Governor, however, sent the Premier and his colleagues about their business, and called in Hon. Joseph Martin to form a Ministry. The members of the Legislature, almost unanimously, resented this summary method of dealing with them, and passed a resolution of no confidence in Mr. Martin. The Lieutenant-Governor, however, paid no attention to this censure, but, in an almost empty House, prorogued the Legslature, and thus permitted Mr. Martin to proceed with the forming of a new Ministry. He is finding it a far from easy task, and at last accounts had not been able to complete it.

There has been much criticism of the course of the Lieutenant-Governor, and it has been suggested by some that his acts were so arbitrary that he should be recalled by the Dominion Government. Those who suggest such a course forget that we are under constitutional government. The conduct of Lieutenant-Governor McInnes may not meet with general approbation, but there can be no doubt that he was entirely within his rights when he dismissed his advisers. Such a course, however, ought not to be lightly adopted by any governor. He runs a great risk when he chooses to set aside those commanding a majority of the representatives of the people. But when a Lieutenant-Governor so acts, there is always the court of ultimate appeal-the electors of the Province. Mr. Martin, or some one else, if he fails, must appeal at an early date to the people of British Columbia. If the Prime Minister, so designated, so commends himself the majority of the electors, Identenant-Governor will have f cailing, for it will be shown that he has ministers, accepting the responsibility of his acts, who have the confidence of the people. But if Mr. Martin, or any one else, so chosen by Lieutenant-Governor McInnes, fails to secure the support of a majority of those returned at the polls, then the the Lieutenant-Governor would be to recall his former advisers, and take advice from them. If Hon. Mr. Molnnes failed to send for Mr. Semlin, then it might be incumbent on the Dominion Government to deal with him as the Imperial Govrnment has dealt with Colonial Govpriors under like circumstances. It might recall him. This outcome is what Hon. Mr. McInnes has, for the second time, risked. It will be interesting to watch how it all comes out. From a Dominion point of view, this struggle is of little account, as the British Columbia Provincial political parties have never been formed on he lines of national politics. Sir Charles Hibbert Tupper, who now lives in Vancouver, has been trying to have the Province divide on Dominion lines in local affairs, but he has met with small success in con-
