The sealing schooner Minnie, of Victoria, B. C., which was seized last summer for the violation of the modus vivendi in Bering Sea, has been condemned by the court of admiralty at Victoria, B. C.

A company is offering to supply Windsor with natural gas from Leamington by October 31, the cost to consumers not to exceed 90 cents per 1,000 feet, with adequate reductions for large consumers.
