The attendance of the farmers was much larger than one would imagine, as the buyers were out early and were anxious to do business, consequently a number of sales were made earlier than usual.

Poultry was in nearly every vehicle, and formed the bulk of the supplies offered on the square. Sales were brisk and prices as a rule were a shade higher.

Grain—There was a fair supply of oats, about 25 loads were on sale. Prices ruled 55c to 58c per cwt. Three loads of wheat were at \$1 per bushel.

A couple of loads of barley, 90c and 92c per cwt. A small lot of beans sold at \$1.25 per bushel.

Several loads of hay were offered. Sales were made at \$8 per ton.

Butter and Eggs—There was considerable offered in this line. Sales were quite brisk for the best quality of butter at 16 1/2c to 18c for crocks, and 12c for pound rolls. Eggs were in good demand at 24c to 26c per dozen wholesale, and 27c to 28c per dozen retail.
