

SNATCHED BILLS  
FROM A BUTCHER

W. S. McDougall Says Fred Maudsley Struck Him on the Eye and Took Money.

## TRIO IN POLICE COURT

Trio Pleading Not Guilty and Case Was Enlarged—Fred Maudsley Reserved His Plea in Court Today.

The sight of a big roll of bills containing \$100, which William S. McDougall, a local wholesale butcher, doing business on Dundas street, was counting out in the washroom of the Windsor Hotel, on King street, about 6 o'clock on Saturday evening, was paid to John Macgregor, another butcher, proved too great a temptation to Fred Maudsley, of 755 Grey street, and to John Macgregor, of 383 York street, and it is alleged that they made a sensational attempt to snatch the money.

Another man, named Thomas Pritchard, of 472½ Richmond street, was arrested and charged with Maudsley and Dowling when Deputy Magistrate Graydon at the police court this morning.

Maudsley reserved his plea, but elected a \$5 fine by Deputy Magistrate Graydon.

Both Pritchard and Pritchard pleaded not guilty and elected summary trial. The case was laid over until Monday, next.

**The Victim's Story.**  
According to Mr. W. S. McDougall, he went into the washroom to settle up his accounts with Mr. Macgregor.

"I sat down and was arranging the bills on my knee," he told The Advertiser today. "The bills were all crumpled up from being jammed in my pocket any old way, and I was separating them. I was going to pay Macgregor \$50, and asked Pritchard to come in and count the money after me to see that everything was all right. I had the money spread out when Maudsley and Dowling came in."

Maudsley hit me in the eye and grabbed the roll of bills. I hung on to it and tried to strike him with my right hand, but he said, 'I don't know who you are, but I don't want to hear of you hitting me.' Maudsley went out and Dowling disappeared."

**Money on the Floor.**  
A lot of the bills were torn, and pieces of them lay on the floor. Maudsley and Pritchard remained with McDougall, and he picked up the pieces of the notes and then asked them if they could go out and have an oyster stew with him.

They agreed, and when near the corner of Richmond and King streets, Mr. McDougall saw P. C. Cecil McRoberts. He told him what had happened and turned Maudsley and Pritchard over to him.

**\$50 in the Lavatory.**  
Maudsley was arrested in a lavatory about 10 o'clock Sunday morning by P. C. William McDougall.

A search in a lavatory resulted in the finding of \$50, and among the bills were several of those that had been torn, which included the pieces which Mr. McDougall picked up on the floor.

When the rest of the money is not yet known, but the detectives hope to find it shortly.

**Well-Known Characters.**  
Fred Maudsley will be remembered from his association with Texas Burdell and the famous "Shooting Billy" shooting case of 1908. Since that time he served a six-month term in the Kingston penitentiary in connection with the hold-up of a man named Ward in the Grand Central Hotel.

Since being released Maudsley married a young woman of this city, and the couple have had no trouble with him until the latter of Saturday night.

**Looking for Money.**  
Detectives Nickle and Egelton have been out all this morning trying to locate the remainder of the \$150 which Mr. McDougall lost.

Mr. McDougall stated to The Advertiser this afternoon that Maudsley, who had been in the penitentiary, had been out for 24 hours he would return the money.

"He struck me twice in the hotel," said Mr. McDougall. "The first time was when he hit me in the eye, and the second time was when he hit me on the head. Then after that I wasn't going to let him, and stood in front of the door. He hit me again. It was either bowling or Pritchard that held my hand so that I could not strike him."

The police state that the only person who saw the money found in the lavatory at Maudsley's home could have got there was for Dowling to have forced it where it was found. They believe that that the amount found represented Maudsley's share of the money taken. The detectives expect to locate the rest of the money very shortly.

**REPUTABLE CLAIM.**  
New York, April 10.—Mrs. E. L. Davies, of New York, appeared before surrogate court and repudiated any claim that she had made in the case of the late Thomas T. Eckert, whose will is being contested. She was allowed to go after the had made the claim, and her son, James A. Dore, promised to take care of her.

CHINESE TROOPS  
HAVE MUTINIED

A Serious Situation Is Reported at Canton.

## TARTAR GENERAL SLAIN

The Citizens of Chinese City Are Fleeing to the Country.

London, April 10.—The Times claims to have advice to the effect that all the northern troops stationed at Canton have mutinied because they are annoyed over the action of the Prince Regent in proclaiming himself commander in chief of the army. The paper states that citizens at Canton are fleeing to the country.

The London Daily Express published a dispatch from its Hong Kong correspondent this morning saying that a serious revolution at Canton was reported. The Tartar general commanding the troops was said to have been murdered. There has been no official confirmation of this report. On April 3, an imperial edict was issued proclaiming the Prince Regent commander of the army.
