

DOUBLE MURDER ON RESERVE TWO INDIANS UNDER ARREST TRAGEDY ON WALPOLE ISLAND

Bodies of the Slain Found In the St. Clair River, and Signs of Desperate Struggle In Hut.

CHARLES NAHEE AND ADAM JOHNS CRUELLY MURDERED MONDAY NIGHT

Stephen Kiyosk and His Wife Have Been Placed Under Arrest and Are Now In Jail at Port Lambton Awaiting Investigation.

Port Lambton, Jan. 4.—Stephen Kiyosk and his wife, Flossie Williams, two Walpole Island Indians, are locked up in the Port Lambton jail on a charge of murder, following the discovery in St. Clair River this afternoon of the shot-riddled bodies of Charles Nahée and Adam Johns, also Indians.

From the evidence which they have secured the authorities believe that Kiyosk, believing his wife to be unduly intimate with Nahée and Johns, went to their cabin on Squirrel Island, shot Johns through a window with a shotgun, entered the house, pursued Nahée to an upper story and blew out his brains. The bodies were then dragged into a rowboat, conveyed down the river to a point opposite Sloman's Landing on the Michigan shore and thrown overboard.

AN ISOLATED SPOT.

The cabin in which the deed was committed is on Squirrel Island, near the banks of a creek, an isolated spot, connected with Walpole Island, which lies to the north, by a wooden bridge.

It is surrounded by thick woods, far distant from any other habitation, and it was not until Wednesday morning that traces of the crime were discovered. One of the islanders called at the cabin and, receiving no answer to his knocking, forced the door and entered.

A TERRIBLE STRUGGLE.

The floor and walls were covered with blood, the glass in one of the windows was broken, and overturned furniture, with playing cards scattered about the floor, gave evidence of a terrible struggle. On the walls were the marks of shot, and several wisps of hair were driven into the boards.

A trail of blood led upstairs to an attic, where there were evidences of another desperate struggle. The walls of this room were bespattered with blood, and on the floor was a large pool of the vital fluid. It is here that Nahée is believed to have met his death.

TRACES NEAR THE RIVER.

Bloodstains on the snow and ice which fringed the river showed where the bodies were dragged to the edge of the water.

The alarm was given, and a few hours' search by the Indian police resulted in the finding of Kiyosk's boat under the shore of the island nearly opposite the spot where the bodies were afterwards found. The floor and seats were smeared with blood.

Simultaneously with the discovery of the boat, it was learned that Kiyosk and his wife had not been seen since New Year's night. A search was at once instituted and Kiyosk was captured by the island police about dusk last night while attempting to cross to the mainland by way of the Snycarte River. He was detained in his house on the island all that night, and after the finding of the bodies this afternoon was formally arrested by Constables Charles Peters and Lightning Dodge. They delivered him to the authorities at Port Lambton.

WIFE ARRESTED, TOO.

The woman was arrested at the home of her father, Angus Williams, on the main island.

Both prisoners are said to have admitted being at the cabin on the night in question, but deny all knowledge of the crime.

The body of Nahée was found about noon. He had been shot through the forehead, and the face was terribly mangled. Johns' body was found some hours later. A charge of heavy shot had torn through his abdomen.

An inquest will be held on the island tomorrow.

About one year ago a fight took place on the same island which was the scene of Monday night's tragedy. One of the participants, an Indian, was locked up in a building and later burned to death, some of his companions having set the place on fire.

Brener was represented by Mr. Edmund Meredith, K. C. He was found guilty, but was allowed to go with a warning, sentence being suspended.

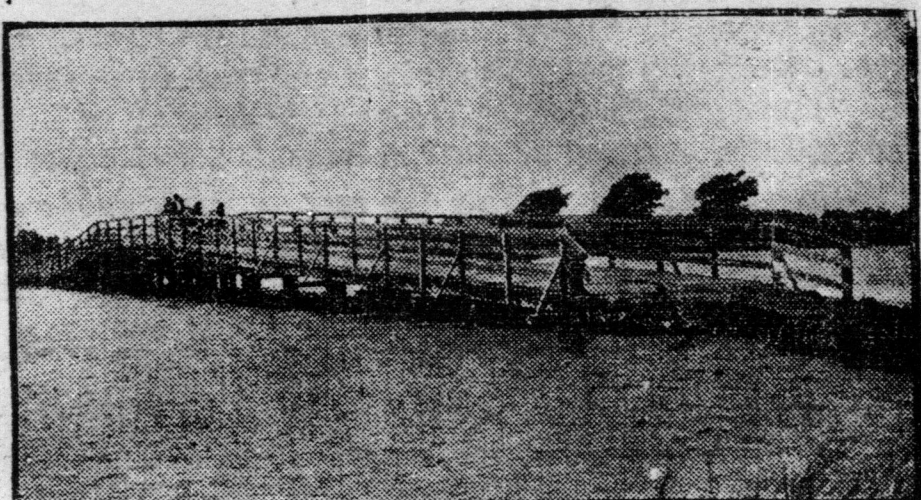
TAKE OFF YOUR SNOW

FIRE CAUSES \$50,000 DAMAGE IN BIG GODERICH ELEVATOR

Firemen Had Hard Fight to Confine Blaze to Upper Story of Big Structure—Great Loss Occasioned by Water Soaking Wheat Stored Below.

Goderich, Jan. 5.—Fire, which broke out shortly after 8 o'clock this morning in the top story of the Western Canada Flour Mills' elevator, did damage which will amount to about \$50,000 before it was extinguished.

The alarm was responded to promptly, and all the vessels in the harbor sounded their whistles. The fire was a very difficult one to combat, and the biting cold added to the difficulty of the department. The brigade, however, put up a great fight, and confined the fire to the top story. Thousands of dollars' damage was done to wheat through water soaking down through to the lower floors.

It is believed that the fire was caused by electric wires becoming crossed during the gale which raged here all night.

The fire department had only arrived back from a fire in the new public school, where a blaze had started in a cabin and spread to a pile of kindling wood. The blaze was extinguished before any great damage was done.

When the men turned out for the second fire many of their clothes were so saturated with water that they froze on the way, and by the time they reached the elevator many of the fire-fighters resembled walking ice pillars.

THREE MILLION DOLLAR MERGER OF ONTARIO OIL AND GAS

Union Natural Gas Company Formed, Absorbing Many Concerns.

Toronto, Jan. 5.—A three-million-dollar oil and natural gas merger has just been incorporated under a provincial charter, as the Union Natural Gas Company of Canada, Limited. The head office is Niagara Falls, and the companies absorbed are: The Volcanic Oil and Gas Company, the United Fuel Supply Company, the Ridgeway Fuel Supply Company, the Iroquois Pipe Line Company, Limited and the Rondeau Gas and Oil Company.

This merger gets control of the franchises held by these companies in the following Western Ontario municipalities: Tilbury East Township, Raleigh Township, Tilbury West Township, Rochester Township, Maitland Township, Sandwich South Township, Sandwich East Township, Sandwich West Township, Essex, Belle River, Comber, Dover, East Township, Chatham and North Gore Township, Moore Township, Sombra Township, Sombra Township, Camden Township, Dresden, Howard Township, Orford Township, Highgate and Kingsville.

The provisional directors of this amalgamation are A. S. Rogers and C. E. Calvert, of Toronto; D. A. Coste, of Niagara Falls; P. A. Little, L. E. Willet and S. T. McKay, of Buffalo.

"TOUCHED" FOR WATCH AND PIN

Young Man Loses Them in Hotel, But Officer Recovers Property.

THOMAS DAVIS HELD
Alleged That He Had Jewelry in His Possession When Searched by Police.

A little detective work on the part of P. C. William McCullough resulted in the arrest of Thomas Davis at 6 o'clock this morning, charged with the theft of a watch and chain and a tie-pin from a man at the Bank Hotel last night.

Davis appeared in police court and pleaded not guilty. He elected summary trial by Police Magistrate Judd, and was remanded till Tuesday next.

Late last night the police were notified that some person had stolen the articles mentioned from an intoxicated man at the Bank Hotel. Davis was suspected, and his description furnished to the police. McCullough was told of the affair, and as he patrolled his beat near the corner of Dundas and Adelaide streets this morning he came across his man.

At the police station Davis offered serious objection to being searched, and it is said attempted to conceal the articles in his undershirt. However, the property was recovered, and the trial will go on on Monday next. The man who was robbed is employed in a local jewelry store.

TO DRAW MILLION FOR NEW BUILDING

Government to Erect Block on West Side of Sussex Street in the Capital.

Ottawa, Jan. 5.—The Government will place in the estimates to be brought down when Parliament resumes next week, an appropriation of \$1,000,000 for the block to be erected in Ottawa to house the branches and departments now housed in various rented buildings throughout the city. At present \$250,000 is paid out in these rentals. The old Government proposed to erect the building on the west side of Sussex street, but the present administration has decided that this site is unsuitable. There are several other locations under consideration.

400 H.P. READY TO BE HARNESSSED

Superintendent Glaubitz Plans Installation of Turbine at Springbank.

GOOD HEAD OF WATER
Two Million Gallons in Ponds Might Be Utilized for This Purpose.

Superintendent Glaubitz has a scheme for power development at Springbank that may be adopted by the water commissioners. He is confident that 400 horsepower can be developed, which would be worth much in the matter of power factor correction.

He proposes to install a turbine at the pumping station, and generate power from the surplus of the leisure class. "There are about 2,000,000 gallons of water that we could utilize for this purpose," he stated to The Advertiser. "It could be run down the ponds again, bines, and the water would be pumped back into the reservoir for use again. This is a simple process, but I am confident that 400 horsepower could be developed, and this amount would be of great value in the matter of power factor correction. I am working out the details, but it looks like a good proposition to me."

The frost nipped at his ears and the tip of his nose, and his breath seemed to come out in icicles, and when his place of work was reached he did not know whether he was all frozen or only partly so.
