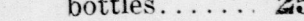

**THEY SAW NO HARM
IN ROBBING GOVERNMENT**

MONTREAL, March 25.—Enoch Emeson, a sergeant-major of the 4th Army Service Corps, and his associates were charged in the court of special sessions today with the theft of a large quantity of army goods, including blankets, shirts and officers' greatcoats. The goods were removed from the Craig Street Drill Hall.

Police Inspector Giroux, of the federal force, who made the arrests, swore he had found the goods in the possession of the accused after he had visited the residence with a search warrant. He also declared that the accused admitted taking the goods, but had remarked "that in the time of war there was no harm in robbing the government."

Enoch Emeson has assisted Detective Giroux to recover a large quantity of goods.
