

### OBITUARY

Death removed a respected citizen early Thursday morning in the person of Jacob S. Bechtel, who passed away at his home on Allen street east at his seventy-fifth year. Mr. Bechtel had been in ill health for two years and had been confined to his bed for the last ten weeks. The immediate cause of death was gangrene. His death came as a relief from much suffering.

The deceased was born in Bloomington in 1840 having been the son of the late Levi Bechtel. After removing to Centerville he conducted the hotel for two years. Thence he came to Waterloo where for many years he was the stage driver between Waterloo and Preston. For twenty-five years he had been in the employ of the Kintz Brewery Company and had been a faithful servant. Two years ago he was superannuated by the company and had been receiving a pension.

He is survived by his wife and six children who are Mrs. John Schill, Battle Creek, Mich.; Mrs. Isiah Snider, Berlin; Mrs. O. Wisner, Berlin; Mrs. E. Schlinger, Tacoma, Wash.; Mrs. R. D. McNichol, Salt Coats, Sask.; Herbert, in Waterloo.

The funeral will be held at the residence at 2 o'clock on Saturday afternoon. After services at the Memorial Church, King street, Berlin, interment will take place on the Memorial Cemetery.

## MANY SIGN THE PETITION FOR A UNIFORM LINE

### EFFORT BEING MADE TO HAVE BUILDING PLACED BACK.

#### Excavation Work on Molson's Bank Offices at King and Erb Streets Has Been Commenced.

A last effort is being made to have a uniform building line on the south side of King street between Erb street and the railway tracks. Citizens are circulating a petition requesting the Executive of the Molson's Bank, the Town Council and Mr. William Snider that the building for which the excavation is being done be placed in line with the other buildings on the west side of the street. They are meeting with a good response. This morning and during the first hour this afternoon seventy two signatures of business men, professional men and workmen were secured.

The petition is to be found at Haehnel's and at W. E. Mitchell's drugstores and all citizens are urged to go to sign it. The petition is as follows:

To the Executive of the Molson's Bank, The Town Council of the Town of Waterloo and William Snider, Esq. "We the undersigned ratepayers, citizens of the Town of Waterloo, earnestly request that the Molson's bank building about to be erected, be placed in line with the other buildings on the west side of King street so that the street may be made uniform in width.

It is very important that this error be rectified at once, otherwise King street for all time to come will be narrower at this point and this is very desirable from every point of view."

The action of the ratepayers who are circulating a petition is timely. As the excavating for the new building is being done immediate action was necessary. If the proper representations are made to the bank, to Mr. Snider and the Town Council an understanding agreeable to all should be arrived at. To the ratepayers we wish to say: "Sign the petition."


