



Any person who is the sole head-of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitobos, Sasisachewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion lands Agency or Subproxy may be made, at any agency or the district. Entry by proxy may be made, at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Regulations




