Victims for Yappers.
From the London Times.
Few persons are aware of the extensive nature of the victimising on board the great ocean steamers. Each vessel is provisioned as follows for the passengers and crew: Three thousand five hundred pounds of butter, 3000 hams; 1600 pounds of biscuits, exclusive of those supplied for the crew; 8000 pounds of grapes, almonds, figs and other dainties; 1500 pounds of jams and jellies; tinned meats, 6000 pounds; dried beans, 3000 pounds; rice, 40 tons; flour 300 barrels, and eggs, 1200 dozen. Fresh vegetables, dead meat and live bullocks, sheep, pigs, geese, turkeys, ducks, fowls, fish and various game are generally supplied at each port, so that it is difficult to estimate them. Probably two dozen bullocks and 60 sheep would be a fair average for the whole voyage, and the rest may be inferred in proportion. During the summer months, when travelling is heavy, 25 fowls are often used in soup for a single dinner.
