Three thousand five hundred pounds of butter; 3000 hams; 1600 pounds of biscuits, exclusive of those supplied for the crew; 8000 pounds of grapes, almonds, figs and other dessert fruits; 1500 pounds; soft jams and jellies; tinned meats, 6000 pounds; dried beans, 3000 pounds; protatoes, 3000 pounds; onions, 5000 pounds; potatoes, 3000 pounds; onions, 5000 pounds; potatoes, dozen.
