Government Bills in Committee. Mr. Hardy's bill for the payment of jurors on Sundays was passed by the committée of the whole house. Amend-ments were added providing for the payment of mileage to a juror in the event of a county council passing a bylaw authorizing it, in going to and returning from his place of residence where an adjournment over Sunday takes place, and making it a contempt of court, severely punishable, for any person interested in a civil suit in any court or his solicitor to directly or indirectly speak to a juror upon the jury panel or "to treat any such juror to drink, cigars or other refreshment." Mr. Gibson's bill for the further pro-tection of children was also passed in committee of the whole. An amend-ment was made rendering any attempt to induce children to leave Government institutions punishable by a fine of \$20 and costs. Another amendment was added preventing parents or guardians from obtaining the custody of or inter-
