Canada. The Division of Entomology of the Experimental Farms Branch of the Dom-inion Department of Agriculture, Ottawa, has recently issued a bulletin by Dr. C. Gordon Hewitt, Dominion Entomologist, on "The Control of Insect Pests in Can-ada."

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
