Hampshire, forty two pounds, to indemnify myself and family tor losses sustained by our country's enemics. This was of eminent service to me. Mr. Johnson left with Mr. Charles Apthorp, of Boston, the sum which my son's redemption cost, for Col. Schuyler, who had paid the same. But the General Assembly of Massachusetts afterwards paid Col. Schuyler his demand

for redeeming my fon.

By Mr. Johnton I had feven children; two tons and a daughter died in infancy. Sylvanus, with whom the reader is acquainted, now lives in Charlestown. fanna married Capt. Samuel Wetherbee, and has been the mother of fitteen children, among which were five at two Polly married Col. Timothy Bedel, of Haverhill—thed in August 1789. Captive married Col. George Kimball.— In the year 1762 I married Mr. John Hastings, my present husband; he was one of the first settlers in Charlestown; I recollect to have feen him when I vifited the place in the year 1744—he suffered much by the Indians, and assisted in defending the town during the wars.
