For a misrepresenting agency man to take any part in church affairs is acting the hypocrite to perfection. They do it, and clergymen allow it. And for an editor of a paper to ask the public to believe that misreporting agency men are honest in their intentions in face of the facts known about their disgraceful doings must we think have some personal object to serve.

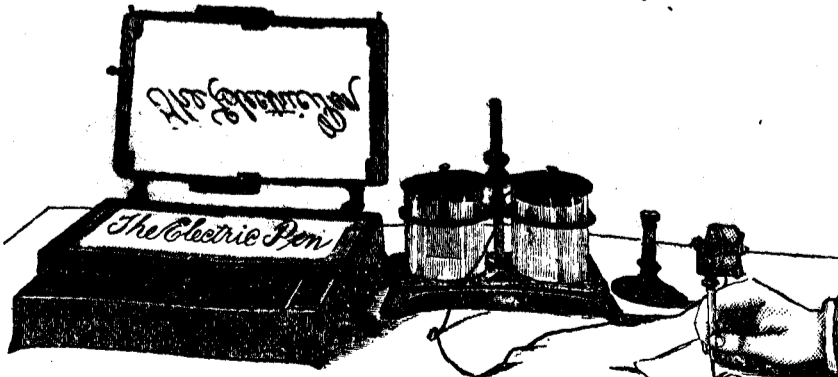

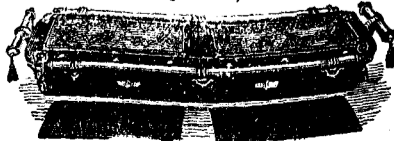
